- English Language Proficiency: Applicants are required to have a command of oral and written English. Those who do not hold a baccalaureate or other advanced degree from the U.S., OR a baccalaureate or other advanced degree from a predetermined country on the waiver list (https://www.unomaha.edu/office-of-graduate-studies/admissions/entrance-exams.php), must meet the minimum language proficiency score requirement in order to be considered for
 - Paper-based TOEFL: 550, Internet-based TOEFL: 80, IELTS: 6.5, PTE: 53, Duolingo: 105
- Statement of Purpose: The statement, 1-2 pages single spaced should articulate the applicant's career goals any relevant work or life experience, reason for pursuing a graduate certificate, and anything else that might help convey the applicant's personality, spirit, or intellectual character.
